## Each term we will send you an overview of our learning in each area of the curriculum for the term. You can also find it on the website. It looks like this:

#### **Humanities**

- In geography, we will be learning to: Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans
- Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas.

- In history, we will be learning to:
  Explore the history of flying for humans.
  Explore local and global inventors who were involved in flight travel. E.g. Eilmer the
- Monk, George Cayley, The Wright Brothers, Time Peake, Neil Armstrong and Amelia Earheart.

#### <u>Maths</u>

- We will be learning to: Count, read and write numbers to 50 in numerals.
- Count forwards and backwards from any given number from 0-50.
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations.
- Read and write numbers from 1-20 in numerals.
- Sequence events in chronological order using language (e.g. before, after, tomorrow, yesterday).
- Recognising and saying days and months.
- Recognising and naming some 2D and 3D shapes.

#### Year 1 Term 1

#### Art/ DT

- In art, we will be learning to: Explore shape, line, colour, pattern, texture,
- form and space.
- Participate in a whole school art project based on 'The Dot" by Peter Reynolds.
- In DT, we will be learning to:
- Select and use appropriate tools to make hot air balloons or parachutes.

## Book change days

# Phonics



We will learning phonics using Little Wandle which is the phonics and reading scheme at Kingfisher. Children will learn a new phoneme each day and begin to blend them to read and use them to write. Come along to the phonics workshop on Wednesday 21th September 2023 to find out more.
