Phonics and Reading

Pip Class

In Pip class we have started to introduce the foundations for Phonics scheme which is part of the Little Wandle phonics scheme we use throughout the school. We start by focusing on supporting the children to hear the initial sound of words. We will focus on one sound a week by following the games and activities suggested by Little Wandle.

Mini Class

In Mini class we are focusing on the listening skills children need before they start learning phonics. This term we are looking at instrumental sounds. We will be following games and activities where the child will need to be able to differentiate between the different sounds to identify the instruments.







How can I help my child listen?

- Listening is a skill that can be practise and improved!
- Use your child's name to make sure the
- Point out sounds around you and describe them – for example, "Listen to the birds tweeting. They are high up so you need to listen carefully!"

How can I help my child with rhyming

- Children naturally love rhyme and research tells us that it really helps then get ready for reading.
- Sing nursery rhymes and rhyming songs every day. Which song is your child's favourite?
- encourage your child to join in, fo example, "Hickory, dickory dock, mouse ran up the ... [clock]."
- Make up nonsense rhymes with nar and words, for example, "Mummy, tummy lummy fummy!"

How can I help my child with syllables?

- Syllables are units of sound, groupe together around a yowel.
- Words are broken up into syllables, for example, the word 'crocodile' has three syllables - croc-p-rille
- Being able to hear syllables helps children with their future spelling.
- Count syllables with your child.
- Whose name in your family has the most syllables?

How can I help my child hear sounds within words?

- The smallest units within words are the individual sounds. Children need to be able to hear these sounds so they can match them to letters when they start phonics in Reception.
- Start by drawing attention to the first sound in a word, for example, "Look a the dog! Dog starts with 'd'."
- Play with alliteration (words starting with the same sound). For example, you could try singing familiar nursery rhymes but change the words so they all start with the same sound - "Blinkle binkle bittle bar, bow by bunder bot box basis."
- Break down words into their sounds and see if your child can put the sound together to make the word, for example "Go and get your c-oa-t. C-oa-t. That's right. c-oa-t. coat!"

Sharing books and Reading

In Pip Class your child will bring home a book for pleasure in their coloured folder which you can share together. They are not supposed to be able to read this! In both classes we read stories in groups and individually with all the children. Sharing stories with your children is important to help the learn new vocabulary and beginning to develop a love of reading.
