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


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# Term overview



We will be learning about celebrations and events from around the world as they happen. Please let us know if you would like to come in and share any of your traditions or celebrations with us.

Each term we will send you an overview of our learning in each area of the curriculum for the term. You can also find it on the website. It looks like this:

### <u>Humanities</u>

In geography, we will be learning to:

· Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

Understand the weather in this country and how this differs to other countries and why

In history, we will be learning to:

- Develop an understanding of Black History Month and why it is important.
- Discover the history behind the gun powder plot. Explore the importance of Remembrance.
- Explore inventions and creations used at Christmas time.

### Maths

We will be learning to:

- · Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
- Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.
- Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens.
- Compare, describe and solve practical problems for: lengths and heights, mass/weight and capacity and volume
- Exploring 3D shapes, their vertices, faces and edges.
- Spotting patterns with odd and even numbers

Year 1 Term 2

In art, we will be learning to:

 Explore different artists and their work including Kandinsky, Seurat and Warhol

In DT, we will be learning to:

- · Designing, making and evaluating a Christmas
- Selecting and using appropriate tools to make their

### How are we the same but different too?

We will be learning to:

- · Explore movement, balances, rolls, simple equipment and sequencing in gymnastics.
- Explore and invent engaging playground games that use some or no equipment.

We will be learning to:

- Observe changes across the four seasons.
- Observe and describe weather associated with the seasons
- Observe how day length varies.
- Measure and record simple data.
- Compare and sort information or observations.
- Use simple measuring equipment.

### RE/ PSHE

In RE, we will be learning to:

· Explore what Christmas means to Christians and why it is so important.

In PSHE, we will be learning to:

Understand what it means to belong and be accepted and how this might look for different people.

### Literacy

We will be learning to:

- · Use basic punctuation when writing sentences.
- Verbally construct and rehearse sentences.
- Identify and include different word classes in their sentences (e.g. nouns, adjectives, adverbs, and verbs).
- Use creative language to form repetitive poems.
- · Explore the use of editing and it can support and improve writing.
- Edit a written piece.

# Reading



We are committed as a school to ensuring all children develop the skills they need to read independently and have access to life long learning. Our team believe in ensuring all children find themselves represented in books. We aim to expose our children to high quality, award winning and diverse literature.

## Book change days

Please ensure both books are in your child's book bags for Monday to be collected in. We have Book Club every Monday where we share our books, discuss what we liked about them and recommend to each other. We then come home with a new one! Your child's new phonics book will be sent home on a Thursday after they have read it three times in class.

Share books that your children bring home from school. Read any books you have at home. Read recipes, magazines, print in the environment. Let your children see you reading!






# Phonics



We will continue learning a new phoneme each day. We will be introducing digraphs which are two letters that make one sound.

Our main focus is for every child to be blending and reading words. We will also learn new tricky words which can't be sounded out.



## Phonics vs sharing books

Your child will bring home a book for pleasure on a Monday which you can share together. They are not supposed to be able to read this!

All children read 3 times per week in school with a phonics book matched to their ability. Our aim is to get them reading by sight and with fluency. We also work on comprehension skills. These come home on a Thursday. They will have no words until your child can blend with sounds to read. Please use the prompts in the covers of the books for phonemes to check, words to discuss and questions to answer.

## How you can help at home

Each week we will share a recap of the learning we have covered in phonics. You can work on these at home with your child. This will be explained in more detail at the workshop.
