Term overview



We will be learning about people who have made a difference to our world. In History this includes Mary Anning and in Science we will be learning about different scientists who have created new materials such as Tarmac and rubber. We will also be continuing to learn about materials and see how they can be changed.



Humanities

In History, we will be learning:

- about the Victorian, Mary Anning and why she is considered a significant individual.
- how her discoveries have steered the science of palaeontology,
- · the obstacles she had to overcome.

Art/ DT

In DT, we will be learning to:

- Making planters to encourage bees and other pollinators onto our school grounds,
- research what planters look like, where they should be placed and what plants to grow in them.
- Designing and making planters from wood and/or other materials

RE/ PSHE

In RE, we will be learning about: What do Christians think about God.

In PSHE, we will be learning all about

How we recognise an manage our feelings.

Who has made a difference to our world?

Maths

We will be learning:

- Measurement Money and Length, Height,
- · Ordering and comparing
- Solving problems using addition and subtraction
- Multiplication and Division strategies and methods

<u>PE</u>

We will be learning to:

- control a ball with our feet dribbling, passing and
 ctapping
- increasing our skill and ability to throw and catch using different throws and different size and type of ball
- · using these skills in small sided games.

Science

We will be learning to:

 identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for different purposes.

•find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

Literacy

We will be learning to:

- Distinguish between fact and fiction.
- Use our knowledge of sentences to construct descriptions, non- chronological reports.
- Retelling events of the past in different forms such as letters, biography.


Book change days



Share books that your children bring home from school. Read any books you have at home. Read recipes, magazines, print in the environment. Let your children see you reading!


Phonics



We will continue learning phonics using Little Wandle which is the phonics and reading scheme at Kingfisher. Children will consolidate their learning ensuring that they know alternative graphemes and can apply them in their writing.

How you can help at home

Each week we will share a recap of the learning we have covered in phonics. You can work on these at home with your child. Try reading and spelling the words and sentences with each week's phonemes and tricky words.
