Reading & Writing	We are Authors!	Choose your favourite event in a book and turn it into a comic strip.	Choose two characters from a story. Can you write some speech between the characters? Listen to the direct speech song to help. ',' reporting clause.
Communication and Language	We are Linguists & Communicators!	Using your words, give someone a book recommendation. Remember to tell them why you like it and why they might like it.	Practice counting in French. Challenge: Can you go forwards and backwards?
Maths	We are Mathematicians!	Go on a shape or angle hunt around your house. Record your findings. Shapes: 2D or 3D. Angles: right angle, acute angle, obtuse angle.	Practice your 5 times table. Find objects around the house and place them in groups of 5. '3 groups of 5= 15' '3 x 5 = 15'
Understanding the world (Geography & History)	We are Historians & Geographers!	Research a natural disaster and create a poster, presentation, leaflet or book.	Build a model inspired by Natural disasters.
Expressive arts and design (Art & Music)	We are Artists & Musicians!	Try drawing a tessellation picture using a repeated shape. Remember, the pieces need to fit together.	Find a piece of music that makes you feel happy. Draw a picture of what the music makes you think of.
STEM (Science & DT)	We are Scientists & Engineers!	Can you make a toy that uses one of these mechanisms: lever or slider.	Be a scientist: can you investigate light? How can light be changed? What do you notice about shadows? What materials let light pass through? What materials would make good curtains? Why?
Living in the wider world (RE & PSHE)	We are Citizens and Role Models!	Retell a story from the Bible. Why is this story important to Christians?	Write a few sentences explaining how people and their lives can be different. What's the same? What's different?
