Living in the wider world (RE & PSHE)	We are Citizens and Role Models!	Create a picture of your Easter holiday experiences.	Explain to a family member the importance of staying healthy and how we can do this.

How you can help at home


Share books that your children bring home from school. Read any books you have at home. Read recipes, magazines, print in the environment. Let your children see you reading!


Phonics 2



We are continuing to grow the code. We are introducing more digraphs (two letters, one sounds) and trigraphs (three letters, one sounds) that have the same phoneme (sound). We will develop our accuracy with recognising them in words. We will also work on reading more sentences fluently with less sounding out and more expression.

We also need to read these tricky words by sight and spell them correctly.
