Beginning and end of the school day.

Please remember school begins at 8.45 am. This is when children begin their learning. Please be on time. The classroom and hall doors will then be shut and the playground gate locked at 8.55 am. This is to safeguard all our children.

Pick up is at 3.15 pm from either the classroom door for Bryon Class or the far left (as you look at it from the playground) hall door for Anganuzzi Class.

If someone else is picking up, please inform the class teacher on the door in the morning or the school office during the day. If it is someone not known to us, you will be asked to set up a password so the teacher on the door knows that this is the agreed pick up. We will not let children go with an unknown adult or with a know adult without prior knowledge of the arrangement. This is of course to safeguard our children.

We are a mobile free zone. We would appreciate all phones to be switched off or put away on the playground. Please greet your child with a smile and not your phone. We know from many years experience that asking how their day was or asking what they did today, is usually met with 0k, I don't know or similar. At the end of the day we have a Five to Flourish discussion when we ask them to think of things they are proud of, they have learned, something that links to our values of embracing hope, building resilience, developing wisdom and choosing service. This may help you have a more productive conversation.

Termly Overview



Each term we will send you an overview of our learning in each area of the curriculum. You can also find it on the website. It looks like this:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This term we will be learning to:

- play with other children and develop storylines together
- try new activities
- · explore and share resources
- · explore our feelings and emotions
- be respectful using kind hands, kind feet and kind words

We will be learning to:

- recognise numerals 4 and 5
- match numerals and quantities
- count objects using one numeral name for each object
- identify and compare 2d shapes
- carefully count shape sides
- · order and compare height, length and
- recognise when items are organised into size order

Physical Development_

We will be learning to:

- understand what gymnastics is and why it is important to move safely and regularly
- develop our balance and spatial awareness skills
- · sequence movements into a short, simple routine
- understand the importance of mobility and flexibility
- develop gross motor skills, core and shoulder strength

Understanding the World

- We will be learning:

 about Bonfire Night, Guy Fawkes and firework safety
- about Remembrance Sunday and why we wear poppies information about Diwali, Thanksgiving and Hanukkah and comparing similarities and differences
- about the significance of Christmas to Christians and how it is celebrated around the world

Expressive Arts and Design

We will be learning to:

- identify primary colours (red, yellow, blue)
- mix primary colours to create secondary colours
- combine our colour mixing skills with our previous linework to create unique and personalised pieces
- use a variety of tools to support us when mixing colours

Communication and Language

We will be learning to:

- · share ideas with others
- listen to others in a variety of situations
- join in with familiar stories, rhymes and songs
- respond to two-part instructions
- understand and use topic vocabulary
- ask questions and develop explanations

Literacy

- We will be learning to:

 Iisten to stories and information from non-fiction books
- recall details about settings, characters and events
- recognise familiar words and signs
- recognise and write our own name
- link sounds to letters using Little Wandle
- form letters correctly
- blend and segment simple three letter (CVC) words
- hear when two words rhyme

Phonics



We will continue learning a new phoneme each day. We will be introducing digraphs which are two letters that make one sound.

Our main focus is for every child to be blending and reading words. We will also learn new tricky words which can't be sounded out.

How you can help at home

Share books that your children bring home from school and read any you have at home. Read recipes, magazines, print in the environment. Let your children see you reading!

Ask children to spot the phonemes/ digraphs in a word. If they ask how to spell a word, ask them what phoneme they can hear first, next etc and ask them to write a grapheme for each phoneme.

Reading



We are committed as a school to ensuring all children develop the skills they need to read independently and have access to life long learning. Our team believe in ensuring all children find themselves represented in books. We aim to expose our children to high quality, award winning and diverse literature.

Book change days

Monday Hand in Little Wandle and sharing book. Take home a new sharing book. Monday is also Book Club Day where we share our books, discuss what we liked about them and recommend to each other.

Thursday New Little Wandle book goes home after being read 3 times in school.

Phonics vs sharing books

Monday's book you can share together. They are not supposed to be able to read this!



In Collective Worship...

In our Values assembly on Mondays, we will be using books to think about our school value of Hope and the British Value of Democracy think about how our values are reflected in this and what this means for us as Christians. We always start by welcoming God, then we listen and respond before singing and having a reflection.

On Tuesday we have a assembly with our Chaplain, Owen, in our Chapel. He uses a resource that has been especially written for KSI and is the next in the series from Jack in the Box which they loved in Reception and Yl. Each assembly follows the familiar pattern: Welcome, Learn, Reflect, Respond and as Oscar the Owl 'flies' out of the box he invites children to become involved in each part of the worship journey.

On Wednesday we have a Class Worship - following the same pattern linking a bible story to the book/story from Monday's assembly.

Thursday is a Singing Assembly, learning and worshipping through song, as well as learning songs for events and performances.

Our Friday Celebration Assembly celebrates the learning both inside and outside of school. It's a time for recognition and celebration of our brilliant Kingfishers.
