Term overview



Each term we will send you an overview of our learning in each area of the curriculum for the term. You can see regular updates on Tapestry. You can also find them on the website. It looks like this:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This term we will be:

- getting to know each other, making friends and becoming familiar with school routines
- trying new activities, learning to share and taking turns
- identifying and naming our basic emotions

Maths

In Reception we will be learning to:

- recognise numerals 0-3
- match numerals and quantities
- count objects using one number name for each object
- count irregular groups of objects
- count actions or objects which can't be moved e.g. jumps, claps In Year 1 we will be learning to:

- Count, read and write numbers to 50 in numerals.
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations.
- Read and write numbers from 1-20 in words.

We will all be learning to:

- identify and talk about 2d shapes
- recognise and create patterns
- recognise and say days and months.

Physical Development

We will be learning to:

- put on our cardigans, jumpers and coats by ourselves
- take our shoes, socks and tights off by ourselves and then put them back on
- experiment with different ways of moving
- develop an effective pencil grip and begin to form recognisable marks, shapes and letters
- use scissors effectively and safely
- develop our gross motor skills, core and shoulder strength

Understanding the World

We will be learning:

- about ourselves, each other and our families
- how we have grown and changed since being a baby
- to notice changes in the outdoors through Welly Walks and outdoor learning
- about the season of Autumn and events which take place such as Harvest

Expressive Arts and Design We will be learning to:

- create self-portraits using a variety of resources
- mix colours
- make marks, lines and shapes
- listen to and discriminate between sounds, sing songs and dance to music
- play rhythms on the African drums (Year 1)

Communication and Language

We will be learning to:

- listen carefully, share our ideas with each other trying to use full sentences and respond to what others have said with a relevant response
- join in with familiar stories, rhymes and songs
- respond to simple instructions and ask questions

Literacy

In Reception we will be learning to:

- enjoy listening to and joining in with familiar rhymes and stories
- recognise familiar words and signs
- recognise and write our name
- begin to form recognisable letters link sounds to letters using Little
- hear and say initial sounds in words
- hear and recognise when words rhvme

In Year 1 we will be learning to:

- verbally construct and rehearse sentences.
- read and write captions and sentences
- use finger spaces, capital letters and basic punctuation
- · Identify and include different word classes (e.g. nouns, adjectives, adverbs, and verbs).

We are committed as a school to ensuring all children develop the skills they need to read independently and have access to life long learning. Our team believe in ensuring all children find themselves represented in books. We aim to expose our children to high quality, award winning and diverse literature.

Book change days

Please ensure both books are in your child's book bags for Monday to be collected in. We have Book Club every Monday where we share our books, discuss what we liked about them and recommend to each other. We then come home with a new one! Your child's new phonics book will be sent home on a Thursday after they have read it three times in class.

How you can help at home

Share books that your children bring home from school and read any you have at home. Read recipes, magazines, print in the environment. Let your children see you reading!

Books for pleasure go home on a Monday which you can share together. They are not supposed to be able to read this! They will also bring home a book matched to their phonics ability on a Thursday. Reception's will have no words to start with until your child can blend with sounds to read.

Phonics



Reception

We will begin learning phonics using Little Wandle which is the phonics and reading scheme at Kingfisher. Children will learn a new phoneme each day and begin to blend them to read and

use them to write.






Ask children to spot the phonemes/ digraphs in a word. If they ask how to spell a word, ask them what phoneme they can hear first, next etc and ask them to write a grapheme for each phoneme.
